At Little Fishes Pre-School we understand that every child needs to feel safe and included and parents need a point of contact within the setting. Therefore we allocate a Key Person to each child. This member of staff will be the main point of contact for you and more importantly for your child. You will be told who this key person is and have their role explained to you when your child starts at Little Fishes Pre-School.

The key person will get to know you and your child really well in order to understand them and meet their needs.

The Key Person will keep a record of observations they have made and document your child's progress. This understanding will help them plan learning activities based on your child's individual interests and needs. They will give you regular updates about how your child is settling and progressing in their learning and development.

As a parent, if there's anything you want to discuss or anything you're worried about, you can talk to your child's key person or Nicky (Manager) or Vicki (Deputy Manager).

How can you help your child's Key Person?

- Talk to your child about their key person so that they know they can go to them for help.
- Keep the key person updated with any changes in routines or changes in your child's home life or health needs.
- Share any new interests your child may have with the key person.
- Talk to your child's Key Person if you have any concerns or questions.
